— — — Admission to the MAMC Swing Bed Program requires:

- A minimum 3-night stay at MAMC or other hospital
- Acceptance by a MAMC physician
- Traditional Medicare coverage

SWING BED PROGRAM

The Swing Bed Program at Muleshoe Area Medical Center (MAMC) is for patients discharged from Muleshoe or any other hospital following an acute illness, injury or surgery, who still need time and physical therapy to heal and strengthen before going home.

MAMC's Swing Bed Program eases the transition from acute care to home by providing patients with access to highly trained and caring medical professionals right here in Muleshoe!

Who is eligible for the MAMC Swing Bed Program?

The MAMC Swing Bed Program is for Medicare patients who require:

- Teaching and training to care for a new health problem or condition
- IV Therapy
- Physical Therapy to Strengthen
- Palliative Care (as an alternative to Hospice)

What are the advantages of the MAMC Swing Bed Program to the patient?

- An easier transition from acute care to home
- Continuity care provided by your local physician responsible for your ongoing care

What are the advantages of the Swing Bed Program for family and other caregivers?
